ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

Lions Club of Springfield, Oregon

We, Bryce Thalman, Wilbur Boyd, W. O. Dahl, Tom Fendron and Donald Derickson, of Leers of the Lions Club of Springfield, Oregon, an existing voluntary association, whose names are hereunto subscribed, desiring to form a corporation under and by virtue of Chapter 142, Oregon Laws, 1941, providing for the creation of nonprofit corporations, do hereby associate ourselves together and make and execute in triplicate the following articles of incorporation,

I.
